HEADLINE FINDINGS

International education is identified as a transformative action within the curriculum:

- International education has a major effect on the performance of underachieving learners
- International education develops core ICT and literacy skills among learners
- International education is an important means of professional development and helps refresh contents, resources and motivation
- International education helps to reduce the performance gap amongst pupils
- International education helps schools meet the objectives of inspection bodies
- International education makes the curriculum more stimulating
- International education raises awareness and understanding of different cultures and religions.

Task: To analyse existing British Council and external studies and reports on the impact of international work in UK schools.

Methodology:

- Collected all the seemingly relevant documents
- Screened them by date and relevance, resulting in 26 documents being analysed
- Summarised them by contents and confidence in their findings (reliability and validity)
- Analysed case studies found in the documents
- Conducted cross-report analysis examining impact on learners, teacners, school and communities.

BENEFICIARIES

Four key constituencies benefit from international education:

- Learners
- Teachers
- Schools
- The Wider Community



International education has a major effect on the performance of underachieving learners.

Reports show that this is due to increased engagement, confidence and motivation, in turn boosting self-esteem among those not easily engaged.

International education develops core ICT and literacy skills among learners

Improved ICT and literacy skills were the most commonly cited benefits for pupils in an eTwinning report. Learners showed greater motivation, improved performance and quality of work, and enhanced relationships with staff.

International education helps to reduce the performance gap amongst pupils

Schools who applied to the British Council to have their international education work rewarded consistently demonstrated that they narrowed the achievement gap through the use of international education.
